# Let's read The Outsider...

## Who is The Outsider?

When others laugh and play,  
The outsider keeps shtum,  
People laugh at their odd way,  
And tell them there isn't room.

The outsider jumps left when everyone  
shuffles right  
In a chorus of meows, you'll hear the  
outsider bark  
Excited crowds rush, to push them out  
of sight.  
Shoved shunted and shunned, into the  
cold empty dark.

The outsider thinks differently, they  
call it 'out of the box'.  
You can call them names and snigger,  
They have their own keys to life's many  
locks.  
See them outside the crowd growing  
bigger...

For The Outsiders are pioneers and  
theirs will be the earth!  
They will smash valleys, capture oceans  
and conquer the sky.  
So think about this when you're following  
the herd,  
And you see an outsider, passing you by.



# What literary devices did you spot?



Did you spot these?

- Alliteration: Shoved, shunted and shunned
- Onomatopoeia: Smash valleys
- Rhyme: Play, way
  
- Do you know what rhyme scheme was used?

This is an **A B A B** rhyme scheme.

- Play (A)
- Shtum (B)
- Way (A)
- Room (B)

What other rhyme schemes do you know?

Poems can have **AABB** schemes

E.g.

Double double toil and **trouble**

Fire burn and cauldron **bubble**

Fillet of a fenny **snake**,

In the cauldron boil and **bake**



(Remember: You can also have free verse poems which don't follow any rhyme scheme).

- Let's think about a time you've been an outsider, or left out.

Think about:

- Where you were.
- How you felt.
- What you did.

1. Where were you? Who were you with?

E.g. park, school, friends...

2. How did you feel?

E.g. sad, nervous...

3. What did you do?

E.g. ran, cried, talked to parents...

Create word banks for these words:

Where you were

How you felt

What you did



# Let's make it rhyme!



E.g. if what happened made you feel **sad**, can you think of any words which rhyme with sad?

**(mad, glad, bad...)**



## Sad & mad



- Now we have two words which rhyme, can we put them in a sentence?

*Being left out makes me **sad**  
And being teased? That makes me **mad!***

We have the first lines of our poem!

(If we find more rhyming words we can put them in an ABAB or AABB rhyming scheme).

Let's find some rhyming words.  
Choose a word from your bank, and  
find at least 3 rhyming words for it.

Where I was: At home  
bone, phone, trombone

What I did: Eating lunch  
hunch, bunch, munch

How I felt: Sad  
bad, mad, lad

## Task

You are going to create your own rhyming poem like *The Outsider*.

When you have enough rhyming words you can start putting them in sentences.

If you want to, you can start your poem using these lines:  
Being left out makes me sad  
And being teased? That makes me mad!

Try to use these literary devices as well as your rhyming:

**Alliteration**

**Onomatopoeia**
