
### **Leaving Sacred Heart?**

### **A message from the Chair of Governors**

Dear Parents

I see Mrs McMahon often makes an appeal to parents/carers to show consideration to the local community when they are dropping off and /or picking up children from Sacred Heart. Yesterday I had the misfortune of driving past the school just after 4.30pm and witnessed first-hand the congestion caused by the inconsiderate parking and driving of parents at the school. As I came through the traffic lights from Myddleton Park on to Oakleigh Park South I could see that there was a row of cars illegally parked on the yellow line and overhanging driveways. I was then forced to brake hard as a parent suddenly pulled out of a space onto the wrong side of the road into the oncoming traffic, narrowly missing hitting my car! As I moved on



following this incident I then had to stop again as another parent proceeded to hold up the traffic in both directions by carrying out a multi-point turn close to the traffic lights.

On behalf of the school I would like to ask parents to consider how their behaviour impacts on the reputation of the school. Do you really need to make that manoeuvre that holds up the traffic or could you maybe drive further down the road and make your turn where it will cause less obstruction? Do you really need to pull out of that parking space so quickly that you almost cause an accident? Or could you maybe show a little more patience in front of your child when driving? Please consider that every move you make is witnessed by your child. Having personally experienced the chaos parents' parking is causing I implore you to be more considerate to the local community in future.
